Minutes of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church Congregational Council Meeting of May 16, 2024

Council Members Present: Joey Barnard, Janet Gnann, Chuck McCallar, Lisa Neville, Drew Schwalbe, Kim Screen, Bill Wiggins, and Richard Wolf. Also present: Donald Martin Absent: Andy Foose and Pastor Hartmann Bill Wiggins opened the meeting at 6:10. Joey Barnard gave Devotion.

Pastor's Report: No report, Pastor on Vacation.

Director of Music: Donald Martin reported that the Choir is winding down for the summer break. Choir will not wear Robes at Services after the end of June and will return to Robes after Labor Day. Play performance will be May 31st and June 2nd with a lunch served at the June 2nd performance. Donald reported that a possible candidate is in the works for Rebecca's replacement. Candidate status will be updated in June. Rebecca's last Sunday with us will be June 30th which will be one 10:00 Service with a reception served in Hoffner Hall afterward to honor Rebecca's time with St. Paul's.

Treasurer: Donald reported current church's bank balance of \$8,718.71 in checking for operations which includes \$10,000 transferred from Savings first week of May due to after Easter offering shortage. Savings balance is \$51,503. Mortgage payment for May to Synovus was lost in the mail. A Stop Payment was made on the check and a replacement was issued. Synovus waived any fees due to our payment history. Donald also met with our financial advisors for the Endowment funds at Truist Wealth Services. The endowment's present balance is \$9,044,645.70 which includes Cash Reserve of \$153,907.51. Funds are invested conservatively with Bonds, Blue Chip Stocks, and Financial Instruments of guaranteed growth. Doanld plans to meet quarterly with Truist for a review of accounts with Bill Wiggins and/or Robert Shuman accompanying.

Preschool's operations bank balance is \$3993.01 and Savings \$21,101.56. \$15,000 was moved from Savings to Checking to cover expenses. The income shortage was due to half week tuition given to parents as a requirement of the Federal Aid Grant obtained during COVID to benefit families of students. This tuition benefit ends in June.

A discovery was made that some past payroll tax payments from the COVID months to the State of Georgia were not received. Donald, Fran, and the State of Georgia are working to rectify this error. Per the State of Georgia St. Paul's should not be assessed late fees once a settlement is reached.

A solid buyer is satisfying their Due Diligence to present a written contract for the gym property. More details will be given in June. The gym will not be used for rental activities after May 31st due to possible pending contract.
